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guarantee you that somebody delinquent on child support enforcement is not going to use their Social Security number to go get a driver's license in the state of Nebraska. This is not just Nebraska using this; this is a national program. I had a call from a trucker the other day that had a truck driver stopped in Georgia, deficient on his child support payments in Nebraska. Where did they catch him? At a truck...a weigh station down near Atlanta. So we've got to be careful if we're going to do this. This is a major change in policy. And granted, there's no flexibility in the statutes as written now. It says DMV shall require a Social Security number. And what this bill is doing is changing the validation process. It's not changing the requirement. Senator Synowiecki's amendment proposes to change the requirement that's in existing statute. So I'm going to oppose it on the basis, I think it's very important we maintain this requirement. As I said, there's a number of other issues involved, other than obtaining a driver's license, because we're using that as a child support enforcement tool. And there's a voter registration issue involved with Social Security numbers, and so on. So I don't think we want to change our existing statutes. And that...for those reasons, I'm going to have to oppose Senator Synowiecki's amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Synowiecki, could I ask a couple of questions? Because I'm totally sympathetic with your objection, but concerned about Senator Baker's...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Synowiecki.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...if I'm characterizing his position correctly, that it's...that it would allow too broad an exception, perhaps. As I understand your initial remarks on this, you want to, in a sense, protect those people, or to enable those people who are not legally able to acquire a Social Security number the ability to get a driver's license. Isn't that the group of people you're talking about?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: And Senator Beutler, those that are here in
