SENATOR BAKER: No.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. Okay, thank you, Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Mossey, followed by Senator Aguilar and Schimek. Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Thank you, Mr. President. If I just might pick up a little bit where Senator Aguilar left off, the matricula, which is issued by the Mexican consulate, that came about because of fraudulent ID. And so as a way to combat that, the Mexican consulate decided, well, let's issue the matricula, which, I might point out, is recognized by 13 states, over 800 law enforcement agencies, including Los Angeles Police Department, which is one of the largest police departments in the nation, and numerous banking institutions. And the reason for that is because of the fraudulent ID. This allows them then to open up banking accounts, do numerous things which generate money for these states and agencies. Where I was going with that is that we have over 25,000 illegal immigrants living here in Nebraska, at least. And to make a fake ID is so easy, and to differentiate between the fake ID and the real ID is something that's very difficult to tell, especially when you're dealing with green cards, driver's license. You can buy them in south Omaha pretty easy. And in Mexico, tradition is, is two last names; you have your mother's and your father's surname. So a lot of times what happens is they're interchanged. So you might be "So-and-so Jimenez-Martinez," and you just switch it around to where now you're "Martinez-Jimenez," and that creates a fake ID very easily. And also, when it comes to law enforcement and fake IDs, if you have a fake ID that looks real enough and you get pulled over by a police department and get issued a ticket, you're now in the system. And as far as law enforcement is...knows, that's who you now are, because now you're entered in the system under that person. So if I were to pull somebody over and they had a ticket, and I did a check on them and they come back as being in the computer on file, as far as I know, they're living here legal, because they're entered in the system. And we've dealt with this numerous time after time, with people that come back here after being deported for
