SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members. I apologize if this has already been covered, but I've been on the phone and haven't heard the entire discussion this morning. But I need to ask Senator Baker a question, if I might. And it's just for my own information, Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you yield?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I appreciate what you're doing here, what you're trying to do, but I don't know, and I probably should know, what United States-based identification is. I mean, are there a variety of instruments that qualify?

SENATOR BAKER: There's all sorts of things. I think I'm going to get a list of them here. But that...just...the words are self-explanatory. United States-based birth certificate, baptismal certificates come to mind, certified birth registration, another...a valid or expired operator's license. And it goes...there's a list of actually 30 things here, if you want to look at it. There's a whole bunch of things. Reinstatement letter if they've had a valid driver's license that was revoked, a valid learner's permit, school permit, provisional operator's permit, Nebraska ID card...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So most of them apply to motor vehicles documents or birth documents?

SENATOR BAKER: No, no. Draft cards issued prior to 1973, certified marriage license, certified divorce decree, certified school records...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: ...from grade school or high school, a valid resident alien card, a valid...
