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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Does it include such a thing as a state ID card or...?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. Yes, it does.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: Commercial driver's license...all these, there's...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: ...30 different documents.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. I appreciate that information. And I just...I was curious as to how broad that list was, and what kinds of documents would be included under that category. So you've given me a good idea, I think. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion, Senator Synowiecki. Senator Synowiecki, your light is last. Did you wish to speak, or did you wish to close?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Yeah, Senator Cudaback, I'll just use this as my closing. So, thank you, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: And I too want to echo my appreciation for Senator Baker working with this and getting this amendment that he has crafted. It actually is very similar to our very first draft that we had in our attempt to address this issue of individuals that are here legally and cannot obtain a Social Security number. I will, though, however, continue to have reservations with regard to the validation process. The Department of Motor Vehicles is doing this. It's going on now. And I am just extremely hesitant to put this...put a Nebraska state department rules and regs in the state statute. I am still not convinced that we have to do this. I think it's
