SENATOR BAKER: It is the same amendment. It simply refers to an additional section...subsection that was missed in the floor amendment. And I simply...I have nothing else to add. I'd urge adoption of AM2...is it 2609 or 2109? AM2609. I would urge adoption of AM2609. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: We are now open for discussion on that amendment, AM2609, offered by Senator Baker. Anybody wishing to discuss AM2609? Open for discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I've been following this bill. Senator Baker, I was here for everybody's explanation except yours. So I'm going to ask you to briefly, if you will, state what this amendment does.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you...?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. What it does, Senator Chambers, is it allows a person who's legally in the United States to...that cannot acquire a Social Security number, to obtain a driver's license if he or she presents to the Department of Motor Vehicles a valid United States-based identification as approved by the director, and has fulfilled all other requirements as set forth in this act, which is Motor Vehicle Operator's Act.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this is basically the...a different version of the other amendment that you had covering the same matter?

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Synowiecki...what I just offered...withdrew and offered was...it referred to an additional section we didn't have covered in the floor amendment; same amendment, exactly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. The reason I had to ask the question, because I had familiarized myself with the other version, and I thought that tended to cover the ground. But if this were an amendment that covered something different, I would have wanted it explained. So I do know where you are now. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.
