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off driver's license. In the original LB 227, Senator Aguilar had it so that the fine to be assessed for a conviction under this would be limited to \$50. Well, I can tell you that, just from my reading of this particular amendment, there is no such limit on the amount of fine, or recommendation to the court the fine to be set. Additionally, there's no mention as to the number of points off of a driver's license that a person may be subjected to for conviction of this particular crime that we're talking about, too. And so I guess I just wanted to say that I have some concerns about the import of this particular amendment to LB 227 and would say again, I guess we're all...we are all concerned with the safety of children. This is a well-intentioned statute, but I think with this amendment we're going to have...we're going to come up against some fairly unintended consequences. Because if the bill is amended, if you'll look at the amendment, it says strike the original sections and all amendments and insert the following sections. Well, so you should treat this particular amendment as a brand new bill, as a whole new set of ideas that are going to be incorporated into LB 227, and from my standpoint, I can tell you that that...this particular amendment, if adopted, would substantially change LB 227 as we have it amended to this point. And so at this point I can't...I can't support this amendment. I can't support the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Hartnett, followed by Senators Chambers, Stuthman, Erdman, Beutler, Kremer. Senator Hartnett. I'm sorry.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I have an amendment following and, I think, Senator Beutler's amendment here, and my amendment I think strikes, on page 5, lines 4 through 7; deals with the agriculture worker. Senator Beutler, may I ask you a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Your amendment that we're considering now, as I half-listened, you do strike that exemption there, and I think you said off the mike the only thing that's left is in parades. Is that correct?
