SENATOR BEUTLER: That's correct, Senator. We incorporated your thought on that too.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. The reason I offered the amendment, I thought that...with Senator Quandahl's amendment the other day lowering it to 25 miles was probably the most significant part of the bill, so I thought maybe all these exceptions would...were not necessary after his amendment was adopted by the body. SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Chambers, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I was one of those in the Speaker's office the other day when we hashed out the green copy of the bill and arrived at the amendment that Senator Beutler has presented to us. Rather than say too much at this point, I will see what direction the debate will take, because Senator Beutler and Senator Aguilar explained clearly and adequately what the amendment does. I will reserve my remarks until I see what the reaction of the body seems to be. Thank you.
