SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and moneymaking tend to have a lesser...place a lesser value on all living things. They go from the four-footed to the two-footed, from the brute creation to the so-called rational animal aspect of the creation, and they tend to think in terms of ownership, and they think of living things as property, as livestock. Well, they may think of children as livestock, but I don't, even though children of my complexion were handled and dealt with as livestock, and I don't want to see that ever happen again in this country. And if I have anything to do about it, it won't happen in this state. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, on your amendment to LB 227.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, just wanted to throw out a few dimensions of this thing that might be worth thinking about, especially for people who might be concerned about the transportation of detassellers or whatever. We had a very good discussion about a detasseler and that whole part of our farm culture a year or two ago, and I recall as part of that discussion that many of these groups of kids came from towns, from Grand Island, from Hastings, even they came into Lincoln. I know lots of Lincoln kids go out and detassel corn. And I know from that discussion that there are organized, for example, teachers who spend their summers organizing kids in detasseling trips. And these people, a lot of them, have vans, and there are school buses used. And it seems to me that, as we become ever more sophisticated in society, it's not going to be burdensome on people, who are organizing to do certain businesses, to use vehicles that protect children. I think we're there already, and that's something we try to do in this society. As technology improves the way we can do things, we ask people to use those technologies for the safety and protection of us all. And someone who's hauling Lincoln children out to do detasseling, I think their parents would expect me to work for a law that would
