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SENATOR BEUTLER: ...we should vote to have Senator Aguilar's bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Quandahl.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Mr. President, just at the appropriate time, I'd request that this vote be taken by machine vote.

SENATOR CUDABACK: When it comes to that time, Senator Quandahl, you may request that. Thank you.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Very good.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: May I ask for a ruling from the Chair? Can someone who is not the sponsor of a bill on the advancement of the bill require that it be a machine vote?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, you can. Absolutely, anybody can require a machine vote, Senator Beutler, anybody, request rather.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of this Legislature, I ask you, what next? Are you going to have to be 18 years old to sort cattle? I think that's probably more dangerous than riding in the back of a pickup. Where are we going here? I support all these safety measures, but I don't know how you can make them laws and expect people in rural Nebraska to obey them. I can think of a lot of things on the farm that are dangerous, and maybe we should pass legislation saying that we should outlaw them. I just ask you, what next?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Erdman.
