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used all I want to use. If you want to use the rest of my time, you're welcome to it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, about two and a half minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Thank you, Mr. President. I think you've probably answered what was kind of going around in my mind because...and I'd like to ask you in the form of a question.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This amendment and this bill will relate to more than one place where a person would have to file. Wait a minute, in Lancaster County a person cannot file for more than one office, is that true, at the same time?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't think that you can file for more than one office anywhere.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought we had passed a law sometime ago where in certain areas a person could file for more than one office. Well, can you hold an office and procure another and serve in both of them?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, you can't and, you know, you're getting to an interesting question now, and that is that in most cases you can hold an office, you can file for another one, you can run for that other one, and if you win then you have to give up one of the offices.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought we had passed a bill that would let you hold...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, there are some minor little offices, I think, at the very, very local level...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Uh-huh.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that I think we do allow that.
