SENATOR CHAMBERS: But in any case,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I'd have to go back and check on that, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...it would not apply in Lancaster County...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...anyway.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No. But...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So a person filing would be either using the municipal system or the county system, but not both.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right, and there aren't very many of those municipal systems left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. And in either case, wherever the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...person files, the money would be paid at that location. Then whether at the municipal or county...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...level, it would be then turned over to the treasurer.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That's right. One of the things that I have just learned recently is that people who are on the State Board of Education, there's a quirk in our law that does not allow them to run for another office unless they resign their office. And that's the only one I know of in statute. I thought I would point that out to you, too.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Maybe we'll want to look at that, but I won't bother it right now. I didn't know that either. Thank you,
