SENATOR CUDABACK: The time is up.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, I'm sorry.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend, FA1463. (Legislative Journal page 635.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, to open on FA1463 to LB 963.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, this is the motion that I had mentioned earlier, which would say that Section 3 should be stricken. These motions are for the purpose of allowing discussion. Now Senator Schimek and I can resume our discussion. Senator Schimek, I'm acknowledging that I haven't had the chance really to thoroughly look over any of this, because Friday we quickly adopted the committee amendment, and I didn't try to prevent that, because I'm not really opposed to it. And now we have everything before us that will comprise the bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And that's why I wanted to allow you some time, Senator, to ask your questions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Now, have you had an opportunity to review that language which you were looking at, and I haven't yet?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. And we've just talked to the National Guard, who are in the lobby, and they are paid with federal funds, the Adjutant General is, but there's a cap on that amount, and if they spend more than allotted by the federal government, then state funds are required.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And there is no limit...let me not make it a leading question. Is there a limit to the amount that the state will pay in this regard?
