SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I would assume so, but I can't say that definitively, so I'd better not answer that question, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All righty.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't see anything in the fiscal...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: His salary is the cap. But that is set by the state, I assume.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So never would the amount that is paid exceed the yearly salary of the Adjutant General?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And if I could, Senator,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I would like to go back to the question that you were asking Senator Vrtiska. And it's my understanding that the reason the provision is in there about taking leave is that it...instead of having to take an hour, an hour and a half's leave, or whatever it is, to attend a meeting for a...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: An hour of what...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...federal purpose...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: An hour of what kind of leave?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: An hour of leave. If you...if the Adjutant General has to go to a meeting that's for a federal purpose,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought you said "airius leave," and I didn't know what that was.
