lot like we are in here. When we are in session, we are sometimes up to our eyeballs from early morning until late at night, and don't have time to attend to private business sometimes. And if they are on active duty, they are probably active duty seven days a week. So I suspect there are a lot of reasons for doing that. And you could probably argue whether they were necessary or not, but I'm sure that there are a lot of reasons.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Well, not having time to do something...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...makes sense to me in a lot of different contexts. But if you have to pay your debts anyway, unless somehow they're making less money, or we're calling...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, and that's possible.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...on some kind of greater sacrifice, I don't know why we would reduce the amount of interest that they have to pay on something on an obligation they made. But you're saying that, okay, when they go on active Guard duty, most of them will be making less money than would otherwise be the case? Is that right?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't know if it would be most of them, but some of them, most certainly, could be making less money. And I think I illustrated that with the story about the Guard member who was going on active duty over to Iraq, and was a principal at a high school here in...or middle school here in Nebraska, and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...salary was going to be much reduced.
