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introduced.) On with discussion of the Chambers amendment to LB 963, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. Is Senator Beutler still in the room? I would...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...give him some more time if he...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, are you available for a question from Senator Schimek? I don't...I do not...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...see him.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. I would like to read a little bit from the statute that is the basis for the National Guard. And it does say that the Nebraska National Guard shall be liable at all times to be ordered into active service, and shall be first called out by the Governor on all occasions for military service within the state in time of war, invasions, riot, rebellion, insurrection, disaster, or reasonable apprehension thereof, or upon the requisition of the President of the United States. And that's the basis in law for the military in our state. I would...I really don't have anything else to add. And since Senator Beutler is out of the room, I'll ask Senator Chambers if he would like to take the rest of my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, even though we're discussing parts of the committee amendment beyond Section 3, which is the one that I am attempting to strike--although I'm going to withdraw that. I'm not really trying to strike it. But rather than fabricate amendments that would be shams, I'm just doing it in this fashion. I'm still going to go section by section, because I see things that are not crystal clear to me. If I go into Section 4, which would be found on sheet number one in our bill
