SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...which at least lets you know that this person is associated with the military and this is a military designation. I would like to ask Senator Vrtiska a question, because he may have the answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Vrtiska?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, did they explain why they are creating the position of deputy director? Did anybody explain that yet to you?

SENATOR VRTISKA: They told me originally in the National Guard there was a director. As well as the Adjutant General, there was also a director. And that position was not fulfilled and was left unfulfilled for a good many years. Now they have decided, because of the activities that are going on with the National Guard all over the world, that it was important to have somebody who would be in charge when the Adjutant General was gone. And so they have named a director. Now, when you talk about the deputy director, I would assume that that is one and the same as the director.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it doesn't say that there's a director...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in the National Guard anywhere, as far as you know?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're now on your time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you, Mr. President. We can continue, Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.
