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whether it was...it's only semantics and how you determine what their title is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And it's your time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Well, I only turned on my light to give you a chance to ask some more questions or give us some more information that you may have. As I indicated earlier, Senator, I am not familiar with all of the activities of the National Guard, as I'm sure you're not. But I did sit with the Adjutant General and some of his people for quite a length of time to discuss this bill before I decided to carry the bill. Maybe the wrong thing we did--and I'm not going to be critical of it--but maybe we shouldn't have put these bills all together to make it difficult to understand them in their separation. We're only dealing with one section now. But we do have all three bills. And if I understand you correctly, you're going to address each one of them in a separate manner and try to get a complete understanding of all of them. Is that correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, as we go along, instead of jumping, you know,...

SENATOR VRTISKA: I understand. I understand.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...hither, thither, and yon. Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I'd like to get through this one as best we can. And many times...I'm not going to apologize, because...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...as I indicated, I don't know all of the rules that the National Guard goes by. I did have a discussion with them. But I'm willing to find out information that you want to be made aware of, and will continue to do that. And I'm sure Senator Schimek will also. So with that, my time is about up. I appreciate it. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Schimek. And this will be your third time, Senator.
