SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Chambers, I've been out in the lobby again, and I would...I don't know what your discussion has been in here, but let me give you a sense, at least from what I understand, about this language. And I want to tell you that the explanation is very complex, and I can't possibly begin to understand all of it and bring it back here without thinking about it a lot more. But as I understand it, what Senator Vrtiska said, there is no deputy of any kind right now. There was under General Heng, there was a deputy adjutant general. So that language has been used before. One of the reasons for the terminology "deputy director" is because the Adjutant General also has the title of director. He is director on state business and on...he is the director of NEMA. He is Adjutant General on federal issues. He's also called Adjutant General commonly in the state on state business, because it gets too confusing to mix titles. So one of the reasons I think that they'd like to add the deputy director slot is that it would be clearer that this person could take over, would take over, if the Adjutant General is called on active federal duty and goes to Iraq, or wherever, and has to leave the state. So it's a really internal thing, and I don't think it's important to us necessarily. We need to understand why they're doing it and what it means, but it gives the Adjutant General a little bit of flexibility in assigning duties to this assistant person. And that is as good as I can explain it, because it's a lot more complex than that. But I think that's the essence of it, Senator. And if you would like to ask any other questions, I'd be happy, again, to try to answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, the reason I think it's important is because we're writing new law, and I want it to be clear why we're doing what we're doing.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I didn't mean it is...
