SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the opening on FA1464, offered by Senator Beutler to LB 963. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Chambers. Excuse me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is a good amendment. I believe it will clarify what the intent of the bill is, and will state the intent of the bill. So I support it. Since it is such a straightforward, clear amendment, I'm going to continue my discussion of Section 4. And I will put a motion up there strike it, and not carry it through. But I want to read some language in the existing law. And I'm not going to point out, as I read it, where the amendatory language will occur. On the first sheet of the committee amendment, in the second line 22, which would be down near the bottom of the page--and if you're taking it by page numbers of the amendment, it would be page 2 of the committee amendment, line 22. And again, I'm going to read the language as it appears in the present law, because I'm looking at these various ranks. "The Adjutant General shall appoint an officer with a grade of not less than major who may act as United States property and fiscal officer, an assistant United States property and fiscal officer, with the grade of not less than captain, which officers shall be appointed from among the officers of the Nebraska National Guard and shall have been commissioned officers in the Nebraska National Guard for a period of at least four years and shall have attained the grade of at least captain and first lieutenant, respectively." Now, what puzzles me about the existing language is, if it declares that the person who holds the office shall be not less than a major, it means a major or above, the assistant shall have a position of captain or above. It would seem that anybody with a lesser rank could not have either of these positions. But when you look at the existing language--and maybe they figured it out and that's why they're striking it--it says these officers shall have attained the grade of at least captain and first lieutenant, respectively. So if you said that the rank must be major or captain, the first lieutenant has no business being in there. But that is being stricken. Now I'm going to look at the
