Servicemembers Act anyway. We do not bring those people under LB 963 because LB 963 does not reach those people. Those are federal servicemembers. We cannot reach them with this bill, so that language is superfluous. The problem is when we say, any parts of federal law referred to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...by this Servicemembers Act also are adopted into Nebraska law and we don't know what those provisions of federal law are. They are not identified. They are not specified. They are referred to, and the reference says that any of those that are referred to are brought into Nebraska law, and I'm not willing to do that for the National Guard or anybody else. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would like to weigh in just a minute. I appreciate the fact that Senator Chambers indicated that, and I think it's pretty widely known, that we all support the National Guard and the efforts they're in. It's a whole new issue. As I said the other day, the National Guard was normally considered a local unit that worked with local issues in the state of Nebraska. We've now found that they have been brought into...under the federal act into combat, and some of these things we're trying to do merely mirrors what they're involved in with under the federal act. So I'm having a difficult time in understanding Senator Chambers talking about they can't be brought in under the state because...as state employees since...but when they're...when they become federal employees, it makes...it changes the whole attitude of what we're trying to do. And that's in some sense what part of this bill is trying to do. I'd like to ask Senator Chambers a question, if I might.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.
