federal Servicemembers Civil Relief Act listed in this section or...see, we're not just going to take those portions that are listed in this section...any other portions of federal law referred to in the federal Servicemembers Civil Relief Act. We don't mean just portions of federal law that may be referred to by the sections that are mentioned in LB 963. Take the entire Service Relief Act and any reference therein to any portion of federal law is being adopted by this Legislature.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers. Your light is next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, I realize that I'm in the twilight of my career. I have filed for reelection. I will probably take a leisurely stroll to be elected because I have not campaigned since my very early years in the Legislature. I do a weekly cable television program. I have explained to people how to run against me if they choose to do so. I have explained to them what they have to do if they want to organize an effort to run against me, what they have to do if they want to select a candidate to run against me, and that I will not be offended. I will not be upset or distressed if somebody runs against me. And I will not be offended if somebody wins this office and I'm defeated. This office does not belong to me. As soon as a majority of the people in the 11th Legislative District vote for somebody else, that somebody else is supposed to come down here and represent the interests of the 11th Legislative District. But while I am here, I am going to continue to try to hold us to a high standard of legislating and I want us to understand what we're doing. And if you don't understand, I would want anybody interested in what we did to read what I said and realize that you could have understood if you paid attention. But either you chose not to understand, or upon understanding, it meant nothing to you. I hear all this talk about unfunded federal mandates. And my colleagues sit like knots on logs when we have a provision that is going to incorporate more provisions of federal law than we
