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portions of federal law referred to in the federal Servicemembers Civil Relief Act in existence and effective as of January 1, 2004.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I think it's the same meaning but just said differently.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, it isn't because in the green copy you say referenced in this section. This says, the amendment, the portions of the federal Servicemembers Relief Act listed in this section or any other portions of federal law referred to in the federal Servicemembers Relief Act in existence. They go not just to this section but to anything in that Service Relief Act in existence as of January 1.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator, let me ask you this. I promised myself I wouldn't try to get too involved in this this morning because we did have a really prolonged discussion yesterday, and I had asked you earlier this morning if it would be possible that we could sit down with the National Guard and with you and with Senator Vrtiska in my office and go through the language in this bill so that everybody is comfortable with it. And I, you know, I hate to keep going over the particular provisions of this bill over and over again on the floor without any kind of conclusion to it. Would you be willing to either move...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the bill over to Select or to bracket the bill till a certain time, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it may sound sexist and chauvinistic, but I am partial to women. I really am. I have to ask Senator Schimek a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, are you aware of the fact that we're on an amendment that was not offered by me?
