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federal law, that which has been referenced by anything in this Servicemembers Relief Act is adopted as Nebraska law, and you all don't even know what you're adopting. I wish you would give me carte blanche to offer a bill, one bill, and you would agree with me at the beginning that you will adopt that bill. But you won't agree to do that with me. But the federal government, whom many people hate, you trust so much that you're going to make this blanket adoption of stuff we don't even know what we're talking about, let alone whether...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...we understand it or not. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska, on your amendment AM2675.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. This amendment was brought up, in my opinion and my...I guess and my thoughts were that this would improve the bill, so that it could move. And, apparently, Senator Chambers has indicated he does not agree and that's okay. We all have our reasons for doing what we do, and my reasons were...to take this bill to begin with, was to make some changes in the National Guard law that would perhaps be beneficial. Senator Chambers doesn't think so, and that's fine with me. And so with that in mind, at this time I would like to withdraw this amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Further discussion on the bill itself? Wishing to address the bill itself, I see no light on. Senator Vrtiska, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I appreciate that. Again, as I said earlier, I brought this bill...these bills that were put together in one bill, for the
