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thank you. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of the first part of the divided amendment, FA1472. Further discussion, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Jensen a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, we are substituting the word "department" for "board." So that the record is clear, what department are we talking about?

SENATOR JENSEN: The Health and Human Services Department that really is responsible for the licensure of their...there is a Board of Cosmetology, but here we're referring to the department as that organization that is responsible for the licensure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now let me...what you said threw me a curve. There is a Board of Cosmetology, but the Department of HHS is what this amendment deals with.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So there would have been a board in existence that would interplay with what's in the bill, if the word "board" had stayed there. If the board, if the word "board" had been left in this proposed legislation, there is a board that is discussed in this bill and that board does have something to do with inspecting and other activities related to what we're talking about. Is that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes. There are many boards by different disciplines.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When you say mini boards, do you mean little bitty ones or what?
