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SENATOR JENSEN: No. No, no, (laugh) I...what I'm saying, that there is...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, what do you mean when you say mini boards?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, of different organization there are boards, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, you mean several, several boards.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, several boards.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: Several boards. But here we're talking about really the Department of Health and Human Services Regulation and Licensure. That is the department that we're really talking about here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I think you're missing where I'm going, because I'm not challenging the amendment. What I was going to ask, if we left the word "board" in, there might be confusion as to what we're referring to, because "board" would be referring to work that the department is doing. So this really clarifies, in this part of the bill, that it's the Department of HHS that is being addressed and not any other board.

SENATOR JENSEN: You're exactly right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And, Senator Jensen, I'm not going to ask you a question on this further, because that's clear. I want to explain what was happening to me this morning and why I couldn't stay abreast of what you were doing. The amendment that we're talking about now that has been divided was brought to me shortly before we got to the bill, so I was writing on my copy of the bill the amendatory language. I would strike what would be stricken and write in the amendatory language. What happened was I couldn't keep up with the writing in I had to do and what you were saying. So, as I was writing the latter parts
