tattoo artist unless you were 18, and I just wanted to clarify a couple things. Has nothing to do with tattoo artists, but did you realize that people that are under the age of 18, if they work in a grocery store, can't throw a piece of cardboard in a cardboard bailer? That's illegal. They can't...and this goes a little further, but if they're under 16 they can't even walk into a walk-in cooler. Can't even walk through the doors. Can't do it. It's illegal. If we deliver groceries or you have to make a delivery to a restaurant or a steakhouse, that...if they're under 18 they cannot drive that vehicle to deliver groceries. So I would assume the same law applies for pizza deliveries or anything in Lincoln. You can't be a deliverer unless you're 18 years of age. So I just wanted to address the 18 issue. I do take a little bit of exception with that. And, overall, I am supportive of the bill and listening to the debate. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. And, Senator Cunningham, if a bill prohibiting a 16-year-old from walking into the walk-in cooler at a commercial establishment was here before us, I would object to that as well. I'm unaware of those statutes, but again, if that was the bill that was in front of us, I would object, as that is overregulation, in my mind. Senator Combs, would you continue our dialogue that we had earlier?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Combs, would you yield, please?

SENATOR COMBS: Sure.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Combs. And again, I realize it's not your bill, although you were on the Health Committee and you do have some training in the medical field. And as we talked again, the danger or the harm to the public, as I understand it, is that we are concerned, as policymakers, of a disease being transmitted from tattoo recipient A to tattoo recipient B. Is that an accurate statement?

SENATOR COMBS: If indeed the needle was used on two people, the
