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SENATOR COMBS: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. What type of training does a nurse go through on...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...on needle management? And by that I mean all components of it. You know, striking the skin, disposal, removing it from a canister, all that, what type of training does a nurse have on needle management as it relates to touching a patient's skin with a needle?

SENATOR COMBS: Well, you named a lot of it there. A lot of it has to do also with peripheral training, like blood-borne pathogen training, the kind of education you need about what could be the consequence of improper...you have the training, which is the actual task itself, but you also have the education, the scope of sequela to that action that you have to be familiar with too so...

SENATOR BOURNE: How many hours...how many hours of training would you say are associated with it? And again, we're talking about injection into a vein with a nurse, and we're just talking simple subcutaneous...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...injection with a tattoo artist.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Bourne and Senator Combs. Senator Jensen, I'd recognize you to close on this section of the amendment.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I think the amendment is pretty self-explanatory. It does, when we talk about a board, we're talking about the Board of Cosmetology, but here we're talking about the Department of Regulation and Licensure, Health and Human Services System. With that, I would just ask for the adoption of this section. Thank you, Mr. President.
