Senator Mossey appeared in support of his confirmation. Number three was Rebecca Schroeder, also a new appointment, a clinical psychologist from Curtis, Nebraska, out in Frontier County. Number four is Michael Sitorius, a reappointment, physician and chair of the department of family practice at UNMC. Number five is William Welch, a reappointment, CEO from Jefferson Community Health Center in Fairbury, Nebraska.
