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know, we...this is what we're asking our people to do. This weekend, I was working in my store. And I have a little area in the back that I prepare all of the products that go out onto the...into the meat cases. Well, it was almost a steady stream of traffic coming back there. I wasn't getting much done. And people were asking me, well, what's going on down there? Why aren't you moving this amendment ahead? Well, we're running in some roadblocks. A lot of people have different ideas on numbers, on locations, so on and so forth. But I don't think that I've ever been involved in a piece of legislation that has been so controversial. Not everyone in my district will agree with me, and I'm sure not everyone in your district will agree with you either that this proposal should not go forward. But on the other hand, to deny them the opportunity to vote on something that this body, you're elected to this Legislature, every one of you, you are supposed to represent your people. Now, if you feel as though representing your people is not letting this measure go forward, well, I'm not too sure about that, because the final decision is not yours to make here, not like something you're going to be putting into the statute. This is a constitutional amendment. Now, if the numbers don't fit you right, then argue your point. I know Senator Loudon would like to see a lot of locations in this state. Well, you know, and if I was in his situation I'd probably be arguing the same point. But you have to be realistic in thinking, now, who is going to build such a casino where there aren't very many people? The logical place is in Omaha, certainly. We all agree that there's enough base there to support one of these establishments. Now, I still think that we should be able to control the number at some certain number in this body. That, I think, is where it needs to be. But for heaven's sakes, trust your constituents, trust them to make the right decision. If this proposal were to get on the ballot and would be defeated, it really wouldn't bother me that much, because I've stated on the floor before, this is something that I do very, very little of. It's not going to bother me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: But I'm thinking of the people that had elected me. And from every indication that I get, I would say
