SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that would have to be worked out by the Bill Drafter. And at some point in the discussion I am going to probably withdraw this amendment. Okay?

SENATOR SMITH: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But we...first we have to settle the germaneness question, because I think actually it will come up again if we don't. Okay?

SENATOR SMITH: You're probably right. (Laugh)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Laugh) Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Senator Schimek. And with all due respect, colleagues, I want to raise issues that I believe are very important in the gambling issue. And ultimately, yes, I don't want casinos in Nebraska, as I've stated numerous times prior. But I believe that we can have a process here that is well within the rules, well within the intent of debate and the intent of formulation of public policy. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. You've heard the opening on the motion to overrule the Chair on the germaneness issue of FA1478 to AM2670. Open for discussion on that motion. Each senator is permitted to speak one time only. Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I do want to speak to the germaneness just for a little bit. And my issue on the germaneness really hasn't to do with germaneness of this subject. The germaneness that I want to talk about is whether we're on the legislative thing or whether we're on Sesame Street. And for the people that think they're watching Sesame Street, Ernie is right behind me. He is not hiding today. (Laughter) So he is with me. So we're not going to be looking for him. So that is the first issue that I have as far as the germaneness. The only other thing that I'm really concerned about with this, and that is the discussion that I had
