FA1481 says that it would be a ten-year renewal. And I believe that...I filed this because we're tending to get away from the discussion of the renewal vote that I think is an integral part of this. Other states have done it. I think it's relevant to the discussion, certainly, and we can have the discussion on the amendment at hand that I think is certainly important. And I would urge the adoption of FA1481.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. You've heard the opening on FA1481 to AM2670. Further discussion...or discussion on that motion? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I would suggest that you decline this amendment, as you should decline Senator Smith's original amendment. Once again, with short terms like five years and ten years, requiring a vote, an affirmation vote, would not allow anybody to put a substantial long-term investment into a casino location if they didn't know that the investment would be good for a period of years that is considerably longer than either five or ten years. So an amendment like this one, whether in its original form or in its amended form, is essentially a killing amendment, not directly, but indirectly, same effect. It can't be done this way. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Further discussion on the FA1481? Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I'd like to ask Senator Beutler a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you yield?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Beutler, could you explain a little more in detail how this is a killing amendment, the renewal? Because I heard your brief, but I want to make sure that I understand your full rationale.
