I'll put up with it, but it's making me tired. Now, this is very nice. These are states with bicameral legislatures, so it's a great accomplishment. We have a Unicameral. The other house in our body are the people of Nebraska. Last year they brought a petition which had more than a satisfactory number of votes telling us what they wanted to vote on; got tied up in court. This year we have some more efforts going on from the other house of our Legislature to tell us what they want to vote on. Does the senate in a bicameral state ignore what the house tells them? Let's not be paternalistic here. We're an elected body. We're representative of our different areas, and our different areas do have different opinions about the gambling issue. But let's let it get to that point. I admire the amendments that have been rather conciliatory that have tried to address the concerns that have been brought up. It's been difficult for me to sit through the discussions of the amendments for things that could be taken next year if the people give us the right to control gambling. Now, again, we are elected representatives, and some of us feel that we must be paternalistic because our people don't know what they want. Okay, then vote that way. But let's get to a vote. I'm just getting tired of gravel being thrown in the gears, because that's exactly what it seems...it feels like to me, and I can only speak for myself. However, when you call for a show of hands of people in the Chamber and you only got a handful of us, less than half of us in here, I think it speaks to what we're doing or not doing. We are not accomplishing much here. So I would encourage the body to move forward. Think about where you are. This is Select File. You know, it shouldn't be rocket science. Most of us know where we are. Let's make this something that's presentable on the ballot for the people. This is going in the constitution. It should be fairly simple and straightforward. We can do all the minutia and all the maneuvering and all the five and three, and ten and five, and all these things that I've read on my gadget that are just waiting for us to look at on there, we can do that next year if the people tell us to. We're working for the people, folks, not ourselves. I think it's a pretty clear mandate what my people have told me and what the people across Nebraska have said. You know, we can be a pillar in two different ways. We can be a pillar like this piece of granite behind me...
