something that's better than what's on there, we risk getting the other thing. If we want to fight it, the time to fight is when there's a balance, at least, of what you're offering on the ballot. There's plenty of time to fight. We've got the whole interim to fight before it's voted on. But I have to agree with Senator Schimek. If we do not do something then we have totally ignored the other house of our Legislature and we've not given balance to the whole risk-management perspective of what we're trying to do in offering something on the ballot. Again, I say we don't want to ignore our fellow Nebraskans. I can tell you what happens in a bicameral legislature when one house ignores the other. It's not fun. It's not pretty. And I'm willing to stand here and sit through all these amendments, that's fine, if it's really going to make it better and we're going to have a votable product. My intention is to have a competitive product on that ballot, from a risk-management perspective, when we risk balancing what we offer against what's out there that they are going to offer, that it's something that will allow the Legislature to control it and is reasonable, and that's if it goes that far. And with our scorecard 2003 that was distributed, if in fact this is true, then why be afraid of putting anything on the ballot if the people are going to say no anyway? At least satisfy the people who have spoken their opinion in a majority number and certainly voiced their willingness to support that side of the issue through all the money that they've already raised to put behind it. From a risk-management, business perspective, it would not be wise to just ignore that. Again, we're not disenfranchised so, you know, this deal, throw gravel in the gears, you know, someone just told me that the original way that we got the word "sabotage,"...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COMBS: ...when the Chinese were becoming mechanized through the industrial revolution and they were going to be losing their jobs, what they did, their sandals were called "sabots," and so they took their sandals and threw them in the gears of the machinery, and that's where we got "sabotage." So not saying that's what we're doing here, but that was an interesting point that someone made to me earlier. So again, I
