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don't think I see him. Senator Janssen waives the opportunity to speak. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I rise and say I oppose the bracket motion. I just...I'm not...haven't entered the debate very much on this bill, but I think the number, to go back to the original amendment that we were talking about before, I think that the five is probably a more reasonable amendment than eight. Because I think you need a...if you're going to have a...it's a business venture by anybody. You need a volume of people to serve that volume, so I think you need around 100,000 dollar...or 100,000 people to make a casino viable. Senator Erdman, can I ask you some questions?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I'm looking at your sheet of paper that you passed out. And my question is that, of the slot machines at the race track...it was from the National Coalition Against Legalized Gambling, slot machine at race tracks, 19 to 2. Can you tell me, Senator Erdman, how many of these...does Alabama have casino gambling right now? Do you know?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Senator Hartnett, the sheet you're referring to is the scorecard.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Scorecard.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, sorry.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Yeah, that's all right. That I cannot answer, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I think, if I know right, that Illinois has, because I know illinois has casino gambling, Iowa has casino
