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gambling, of the...I'm just going through, the other ones I don't. You don't know whether they have casino gambling or not, or whether this was just expansion of gambling? I think Colorado has gambling of some, you know, limited amount. Is that correct, Senator Erdman?

SENATOR ERDMAN: What was the state again that you just...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Colorado.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Yeah, Colorado does. Senator Hartnett, if you'll compare the line that says slot machines at race tracks and the one that says new casinos, you can compare such states as Massachusetts have both defeated, and you can follow along (inaudible).

SENATOR HARTNETT: No. But how many of these states that you have on this sheet have casino gambling right now and it was a move to expand? Do you know, of these...I don't know how many states are on here.

SENATOR ERDMAN: The issue of expansion, Senator Hartnett, is also on there under expanding casinos. We could look on the slot machines for you, if you would like.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. Yeah, I would.

SENATOR ERDMAN: My staff could.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, I'm real curious, because I think what we...if the constitutional amendment gets on, we are really limiting how many casinos. It's going to be in our constitution and so we can't...we'd have to go back and change our constitution if we wanted to expand beyond that. So I was just interested in your sheet, Senator Erdman, and I will try to...would like to see the research on...of how many of these states that you've listed have casino gambling at this time. Thank you, Mr. President. I'll return my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Stuhr.
