we have two bills moving forward that are very similar in nature. And certainly the members have the right to do that. I just hope that I'm not the one that's criticized for using up time. And that is certainly a very real possibility. I've talked to some folks who want to move on and that's, frankly, why I proposed this bracket motion. And when I inquired as to accommodating a bill without effectively or virtually killing the bill with a bracket motion, I think bracketing this until April 15 is very real and still allows LR 11CA to be debated on Select File and perhaps forwarded to Final Reading as well. But, yes, I'm interested in getting some things done this session and I think the radio said we've passed five bills this session and I think saying that we've passed five bills might even be using the term "bill" a little loosely in terms of impact. But I guess we get criticized for passing a lot of bills, and we get criticized for not passing enough bills. So no matter what we do we're criticized, and I'm sure most of you can identify with that. But again, I believe that bracketing the bill until April 15 is very reasonable and workable and still accommodates the ultimate passage of LR 14CA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, first, let me rise in an endorsement for having the Internet on the floor. Senator Hartnett asked questions about what states do allow what forms of gambling, and I have distributed that through e-mail, the link that you can go to, to find this information through the NCSL. It actually has eight. We tried to go back to six, but that was defeated as well by most of those who are supporting the amendment here. And so, again, we've still come full circle.
