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LR 11CA, saved the body the time. And for the sake of saving the body time today, I will cease my remarks. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I rise, of course, to oppose the bracket because, in all reality, Senator Smith, 4-15 kills the bill. There needs to be a day between Select and Final, unless, of course, you suspend the rules, which I think that would be problematic as well. I think it is disingenuous to say that 4-15 still leaves the bill alive and well. It doesn't. It effectively kills it. So I don't think...you know, if you think about our final days in here, every time we're ready to adjourn and are doing Final Reading, we're not going to be willing to take up a long, lengthy, contentious debate. So just tell it like it is and have people vote up and down...up or down on the bracket motion and I can live with that. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call the question.

SPEAKER BROMM: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before us is whether debate shall cease. All in favor...Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Could we just have a call of the house?

SPEAKER BROMM: The...a call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Members, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators Jones, Friend, Schimek, Stuhr, Kruse, Bromm, Senator
