His name is Mr. Tom Ourada, of Crete. He was there to represent himself. And he works for the public works director for the city of Crete and has been very active in the community improvements and the development of the city of Crete. I would ask for affirmative vote on these three members to the State Electrical Board.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. You've heard the opening on the second report offered by the General Affairs Committee, offered by Chairman Janssen. Any discussion? Seeing no lights on, Senator Janssen, did you wish...he waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is confirmation report offered by the General Affairs Committee. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the second confirmation report offered by the General Affairs Committee. Have you all voted who wish to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal page 734.) 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the confirmation report.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The motion was successful. Next agenda item. (Doctor of the day introduced.) Next agenda item, General File, 2004 senator priority bills. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first bill for consideration this morning, LB 1049, a bill by Senator Cunningham and others. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13, referred to the Business and Labor Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced, Mr. President, to General File. It has been discussed on General File on February 9, February 10. The last time discussed, Senator Louden had offered AM2291 as an amendment to the bill. Senator Schimek had moved to amend Senator Louden's amendment with FA1457, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal page 590.)
