Senator Cunningham is doing. He's trying to control costs to business. But I don't think this is where we should control costs, because we are, in addition to affecting...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...the people that are maybe abusing the system, we are affecting the people who absolutely need this \$200 a week simply to make their rent payment, to make their car payment, to keep in line on their credit cards, and things of that nature. I'll tell you, I've got some information that I got off the Internet about the economic development, actually, the stimulus that's provided to the economy because of unemployment insurance. And it's interesting, because I never thought of unemployment insurance that way. But it actually provides a stimulus to the economy in an economic downturn that we are currently in. And so when Senator Cunningham says, well, we...you know, it's unfair, it's a cost to business, well, I'm going to get some information to you that suggests...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...there's another side to it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Schimek, on your amendment. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Thank you. Mr. President and members, I wonder if I could ask a question of Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Vrtiska, are you available? He is, Senator Schimek. Senator Vrtiska, would you yield?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes, I will.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Senator Vrtiska. You and I talked about this a little bit off the mike, so I'd just like to share that first of all, we did...there was an amendment by the Business and Labor Committee which put LB 953 into LB 951. Correct?

SENATOR VRTISKA: That's correct.
