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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right. That's my intent.

SENATOR LOUDEN: It's for service personnel coming out of the service looking for a job. They'd be eligible for unemployment...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That's my intent, yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...until they could find a job?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Now, would their mustering out pay or anything like that affect those payments, or affect the amount of benefit they could receive?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I suspect that most of these would not be mustered out, as you say. They come back. They're still in the Guard. But they wouldn't be leaving the Guard at any specific time. Many of them will still be in the Guard.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah, okay, thank you,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...Senator Schimek. As my suggestion, I think, as we continue the discussion on FA1457, I would like to see something like this done. I think if the cost isn't excessive I would be willing to support amendment like this. Because certainly, as some of our personnel come out of the service, they're like anyone else, they...it takes them awhile to get relocated again. Sometimes they have jobs waiting for them; they're supposed to have jobs waiting for them when they get out, but that isn't always the case. And so we certainly don't want to let any of those people fall through the cracks, so to speak. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. We're discussing FA1457 to AM2291 to LB 1049. On with discussion, Senator Chambers.
