and take a look at the intent of this program. It is not an entitlement program for us to so easily quit a job. Yes, if there are mitigating circumstances. That's what the administrative law judge is for. But perhaps if we extend the time, we're not going to have people just quitting to collect. That's not the intent of the program. And I cannot argue with individual situations, but I have to say, there's got to be a lot of tremendous situations for \$9.2 million to be saved in two years...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COMBS: ...to just correct the inequities of entitlement program versus catastrophic. Compare it to automobile insurance. Automobile insurance is purchased for the catastrophic and unexpected loss of your vehicle. Insurance companies in California deal with what's called swoop and squat. What's that? You swoop your car in front of a rich-looking car, or a business vehicle, and you squat there and stop so you get rear-ended, and then you've got your little clique that's going to create this situation to collect money. Pat, you know what I'm talking about. That is expensive. I say, and I challenge us in here, we've got the same thing going on with our businesses here in Nebraska, with the people who work in our businesses in Nebraska. And we've got to take a serious look at it. It is not an entitlement program.
