And certainly, to the tune of almost \$10 million in just two years, fiscally, I'm surprised we haven't had people just ramming us to get this done, because it is not affecting the program's integrity as far as what it was intended to do. Now, let's take some of the rationale that's been presented. I have fire insurance on my house. Okay, so with some of this same thinking, am I entitled to just burn down my house so I can collect the benefits that I purchased for catastrophic loss of my home through fire? Why, no. There's arson laws against that. The insurance company would be on me in a heartbeat. You know, they'd be wanting to prosecute me for that. And there are states, like Kentucky, who have outlandish fire rates because people do that a lot. They torch their properties to collect. That's a known fact, just like automobile insurance in California, just like health insurance across the United States. And to answer the question of increasing benefits, I say, if you protect this 10 million bucks over the next two years from the people who are trying to confiscate it from the program that was intended to protect them from catastrophic loss of job, but they're manipulating it to get it, you could probably pay a little better benefit to the people who honestly need it, including the ones...the dolphins that are caught in the tuna fish net. They have recourse, and they can even get a better benefit when we stop the abuse. I challenge anyone to argue that this is not going on. We all know people that have done it. And there is a way out. My esteemed colleague referred to me, after my last episode of speaking, as Cruella De Vil, as in One Hundred and One Dalmatians. Kill those puppies, you know, get rid of them. But you know, Cruella De Vil does have a heart, because she went out in the lobby to check with John Albin to see, how do I help those people? Those people still have a recourse, without the expense of an attorney, and as far as I know, protected in statute against the costs of going to as far as district court if they have to. So I guess I have a bit of a problem...
