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unconstitutional if a case from North or South Dakota goes against their corporate farming legislation. First of all, I-300 has withstood constitutional challenges in state and federal court. Whatever happens with reference to a piece of legislation that is not the same as I-300 has nothing to do with it. So I am very miffed at the fact that the committee did what it did yesterday. And if that bill should get on the agenda, I know it was prioritized, they are in for a fight and I will not need help from anybody else on this floor. While I've been here, I've done everything I could to deflect attacks against I-300. I was greatly disappointed that Senator Vrtiska was dragged into the maelstrom. And as it swirls and spirals and drags downward to the bottom of the sea, everything caught in its coils; Senator Vrtiska wound up spiraling downward faster, ever faster, to a watery perdition. Why do I single out Senator Vrtiska? Because he said he may not vote for the matter on the floor. It should not have been allowed to see the light of day. But every senator is free to vote in the manner that he or she pleases, but I want all of the rural and agricultural people who have seen in I-300 an umbrella of protection, that they have not lost their number one defender. And I guarantee them that I will stop that bill from becoming law, even if it should come up on the agenda. That is a guarantee, or as that man used to say, Orlando (sic-Justin) Wilson I think may have been his name, who had cooking programs on cable, he is from Louisiana, I "garontee" and I mean it. Back to this amendment, I cannot watch and monitor every bill that comes before this Legislature. I don't know what bill this original language was in that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I'm attempting to strike from the existing law. But I know there are bad things in legislation that I'm going to miss. And when I no longer am here, it's going to be a terrible day, not just for the Legislature and its standard of legislating, but for the state. We have people writing laws who do not understand the duties, the responsibilities, and the limitations on the authority of various officials and employees. No law enforcement officer is authorized to prosecute any violation nor to see that any prosecution occurs. When we pass a law and we criminalize conduct, a violator is not deemed...
