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circumstances. Please consider voting yes on the amendment. And if you cannot, then please consider voting yes on the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR COMBS: It's good. And thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Combs. Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members, in our previous discussions, Senator Chambers raised issues about whether or not we had a way to differentiate between people who were less egregious and more egregious in terms of the situations that have been presented by Senator Cunningham. If someone chooses of their own accord to leave a job, is that as bad as if someone has to be fired for some of the stories that Senator Cunningham talked about for having broken the law? And by moving from a situation where it was 7 to 10 weeks' disqualification and the Department of Labor had oversight to determine whether it was a particularly egregious situation or whether the 7 weeks should apply, to 13 weeks automatic, it didn't allow for the distinction. So I have filed an amendment that is quite a ways down, and Senator Cunningham has an amendment that is similar, to have it be from 10 to 13 weeks. So you know, if you're just opposed to anything that provides for a less generous situation to individuals, who by their own choice, either through resigning from the position or through the actions that have caused them to be fired, would be disqualified for a period of time, then you probably are not that interested. But if you believe that there should be, as Senator Chambers pointed out, a distinction for people...we're still going to make it a little bit more difficult, but...in those situations, but if...that there should be a distinction between people who quit and people who are fired for particularly egregious action, then I think you want to consider either my amendment or Senator Cunningham's amendment. And Senator Chambers would probably say that I have picked up on his logic and used it badly. But I don't believe so. And I think that it is our obligation on this floor, and somewhat I believe that we have been shirking some of duty. I don't know if it's because of cloture or whatever, that we don't always...and so I will compliment Senator Cunningham that he
