SPEAKER BROMM: The introducer of the bill has filed a motion to invoke cloture. And so we will proceed to a vote on that motion at this time. Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you. I'd like a call of the house, please.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Cunningham has requested a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Unexcused members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unexcused members...rather, unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Redfield, Senator Schimek, Senator Landis, Senator Connealy. Senator Landis. Waiting on Senator Landis. Senator Cunningham, at this time Senator Landis is not able to be located. Do you wish to wait?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Yes, I do. And I'd like a roll call vote when he gets here.

SPEAKER BROMM: Someone who appears to be Senator Landis has just entered the Chamber, Senator Cunningham, so we may proceed. Senator Cunningham has requested a roll call vote. I'll remind the members, this vote is a cloture vote to cease debate. It does require two-thirds of the Chamber to be successful. And we will proceed with the vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal page 777.)
37 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to invoke cloture.

SPEAKER BROMM: The motion is successful. We'll proceed to vote on the Loudon amendment, AM2291, that we previously had the reconsideration motion on. Mr. Clerk, we'll proceed to vote by machine vote on the Loudon amendment. All in favor say aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to vote? Please
