has given clemency to this bill, not once but twice now, because he advanced it from the Judiciary Committee and has now given it clemency to be discussed on the floor today. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Brown. Chair would now recognize Senator Brashear to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, the committee amendment to LB 625 makes two very minor, and yet we think important, changes to the bill. First, the amendment requires that all personally identifying information with regard to testers under the Nebraska Equal Opportunity Act shall be deleted from the investigative reports by the Nebraska Equal Opportunity Commission before those reports are provided to any investigated party. I suspect that the reason for that deletion and protection of the testers is obvious. Second, the amendment further provides that the commission may collect a fee for the actual cost, actual cost, of producing copies of investigative reports. LB 625 was advanced by your Judiciary Committee unanimously, and I urge your adoption of the amendment and your advancement of the bill. Thank you for your time and attention.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, Senator Brown, just a quick question. This is a very good bill, I'm sure, but I was a little startled by the fiscal note that suggested, could put at risk some federal money in the amount of \$285,000. Could you tell us to what extent you've explored that and what this might mean? I would yield the remainder of my time to Senator Brown.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Since we are dealing with the committee amendment right now, the committee amendment addresses that. By allowing actual and reasonable costs to be assumed then, it...you're not going to have such a great diversion of personnel to a task that you're going to jeopardize the work in such a way that you would jeopardize the federal funds.
