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it's trying to go.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, on page 107 of the committee amendment, they talk about the Interrelated Water Review Board being created, and that board is going to begin to operate if that alternative voluntary negotiation or mediation is unsuccessful. The board will be there to resolve those disputes if an informal attempt fails. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There will be five members. The Governor is one of them, and he or she will chair the meeting, or the Governor's designee. Do you agree with that?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then the Governor will appoint a second member. That means the Governor is one, and a member that will be appointed. Then the other three members will be appointed from a list that has at least six people on it, and that list will be provided by the Nebraska Natural Resources Commission. So is that correct?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, I...yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, some issues will be resolved by a vote of three members. There is one subsection, and I don't want to go into the details of that yet, because I don't want to confuse what I want to ask you as a question. One of the subsections in this particular section will require four votes, at least four. The question that I want to ask you, where in this scheme, does it say that the Governor will or will not be a voting member? I didn't see it.

SENATOR STUHR: I don't...I can't answer that question, Senator Chambers. I'll need to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is the intention that the Governor vote, or
