SENATOR JANSSEN: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schrock, will you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BOURNE: And, Senator Schrock, I'm...I was talking to Senator Erdman and he was trying to impress upon me how important this task force and this policy is to the state of Nebraska, and so...and what I had said to him right before he walked away was that, you know, I'm trying to balance...I'm trying to balance the costs involved with how vital this is to the state. And what I said to Senator Erdman, I said, you know, in your opening you talked about how, you know, it would be a waste ground out in western Nebraska and, you know, if that's...if that's the case then absolutely we need to do something, and if it's \$4 million, we need to find the money. But I'm trying to balance, given that we never have had such a board, versus the cost of it, versus what happens if we do nothing. And my question to Senator Erdman was, and now my question to you is, is, you know, we've never really done this before. Why do we need to do this now? Why is this so important to do right today? Please.
