SENATOR SCHROCK: They were required to have 4, and I believe we had 13.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And over what period of time?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Took place over about 18 months.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did the meetings take place in different locations throughout the state?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, they did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What was the city farthest east that a meeting was held, if you know?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Lincoln, Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What about Omaha?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Omaha...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You said Lincoln, you answered...

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...Omaha was not a site. Kearney was a frequent spot, because of geographic concerns. And we did have one at Ogallala.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And we did have one in Scottsbluff.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now is there still in existence an Ogallala Aquifer?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It stretches from east to west, roughly...

SENATOR SCHROCK: From the Missouri River to the Rocky Mountains.
