amendment and what time I have left I'll turn back to Senator Chambers, since we're talking to his amendment, if he so desires.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Chambers, about two minutes have elapsed from his time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Louden. Thank you, Mr. President. This time it is difficult for me not to depart from just talking mainly about the amendment that I'm offering, but I have a question I must ask of Senator Schrock at this point. Senator Schrock, I'm going to turn to page 2 of the committee amendment, and I'm going to deal with existing language in the statute. I will be starting with page 2, line 8, and this relates to Nebraska Resources Development Fund, and when we get down to line 8 it says the following: such money may be allocated in the form of grants or loans or for acquiring state interests in water and related land resources programs and projects undertaken within the state. Who is going to be acquiring these state interests?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Chambers, I'm not quite sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And let me show you where I'm confused.

SENATOR SCHROCK: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does it mean that the state is going to use money to acquire an interest in water out there that then becomes the state's interest, or does the state have some interests which it will give people money to purchase from the state? And if so, money...that money can be in the form of a grant, it would mean that the state is going to give people money to buy an interest from the state, which, in effect, means the state is giving away its interests to whomever it gives a grant for the purpose of allegedly purchasing that interest? And we're having some consultation, Mr. President, to see if we can get an answer.
